## Rules of the Championship Grande Région



Show - Jumping 2025

#### I. General Rules

#### 1. Organization.

The National Individual Championships consist of 3 Competitions, which take place over 3-4 consecutive days at an outdoor tournament. The championships of the respective categories will take place even if there are less than 5 entries!

#### 2. Organizer.

The organizer is the Luxemburgish Federation FLSE.

## 3. Venue.

The Event will take place at the Herchesfeld in Roeser.

#### 4. Admitted Athletes.

Each Athlete is only allowed to compete in one championship. Only riders from their respective region may take part in the individual championship. All riders may compete in the several competitions. The show is an open show.

#### a) Seniors Individuals

All Athletes nominated and with a riding license issued by this region may take part at the Championship Grande Région. The Championship comprises three Competitions, each taking place on a different day.

#### b) Senior teams

A team consist of four Athletes per region, who must be defined before the start of the event. The Championship comprises three Competitions, each taking place on a different day.

### c) Amateurs Individuals

The definition of amateur is an Athlete, who does not earn money for riding other people's Horses, who is not giving riding lessons, and does not ride sponsored Horses, or for publicity or commercial purposes. The buying and selling of Horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the Athlete's only source of income and do not constitute a business in any form. All Athletes with a riding license issued by this region, who does not compete in the Amateur Championships may take part at the Championship Grande Région. The Championship comprises three Competitions, each taking place on a different day.

#### d) Amateur teams

A team consist of four Athletes per region, who must be defined before the start of the event. The Championship comprises three Competitions, each taking place on a different day.

#### 5. Approved Horses.

All Horses must be registered at their respective Federation. The Horses need to have the age as announced at the respective Competition.

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Horses participating in the Championship must be ridden in the practise arena only by the Athletes who will also compete in the Championship Competitions.

Each Athlete may ride a maximum of 2 Horses in the Initial and second round of the respective championship. If an Athlete wants to ride a 3<sup>rd</sup> Horse, he must define his two Horses for the championship at the show office before the entry closure of the competition. This applies for the final round too, where only one horse is allowed.

All horses must be vaccinated according to the regulations of their country of origin.

#### 6. Competitions.

The competitions are held under the national rules. That means elimination after the 2nd refusal and 1 penalty point per 4 seconds' overtime.

#### 6. Saddlery.

The saddlery allowed will be defined as in article 257 of the FEI Jumping Rules.

#### 7. Judges/ Course Designer / Stewards.

The Officials will be nominated by the FLSE.

#### 8. Starting order.

A draw will take place for the starting order in the initial and second round. The show office has nevertheless the possibility to change the starting order, but only for riders competing two horses and to allow a proper preparation of the 2<sup>nd</sup> horse, considering the order of the random principle.

The final round will be ridden in reverse order after adding up the points of the initial and second round of the Championship (the best rider at the end).

The participants of Championship ride at the beginning of the Competition.

### 9. Prize giving.

No separate placements will be made for initial and second round of the Championship.

#### 10. Ranking and result.

#### a) Individuals

As soon as a horse does not finish a championship round or is eliminated, it is eliminated from the Championship ranking. For the final result, the score of the initial, the second and the final round are added up. **Eligible for podium are all riders with a maximum of 28 fault points.** The score of the winning round is not taken in consideration.

b) Teams

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The total Penalties incurred by the three best placed Athletes of each region in the three Competitions count towards the team placing.

The winner of each Championship will receive a prize in kind, the other placed Athletes will receive a ribbon.

#### 11. Entry for the championship

Athletes from Germany and Luxembourg must enter via NEON before the entry deadline. Athletes from Belgium and France must enter via their regional organization. No guest license has to be paid for the athletes who participate in the Championship.
